

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

The Weatherford Art Association is pleased to announce the winners of Artist of the Month for February. Each month, WAA members can compete for first, second and third place ribbons and the opportunity to showcase their artwork at local Weatherford banks and the Doss Heritage and Culture Center.

First place was awarded to artist Barbara Carey for her oil painting "Jerry from Taos." Barbara sourced this earth tone painting from a photograph taken by her father Frank Ainsa, an amateur photographer who focused on scenes from the southwest. Barbara was with her father when he took this photo of Jerry, a dear friend who lived in Taos Pueblo, and this portrait resonates with his dignity and character. This and other artworks by Barbara will be featured at The Doss Heritage and Culture Center throughout February.

Second place went to Michael McCarty for his mixed media work, "Pisces". A mesmerizing circle of swimming goldfish radiates a peaceful feeling in this work completed with watercolor pencil and pen. Weatherford Art Association invites you to view this work, on display in February at First Bank Texas in downtown Weatherford.

Third place honors were awarded to Sandy Sasser for her acrylic painting, "Mardi Gras". This large, joyful work depicts an incredible detailed view of a Mardi Gras mask, accented in blue, gold and burgundy. You can celebrate this year's Mardi Gras by viewing Sandy's painting in February at the Fort Worth Community Credit Union on South Main Street in Weatherford.

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Dear WAA Members: We have made a change to the way WAA reports the Artist of the Month winners to the outside media. We now report them as the winners for the month they are displayed. 

Color Rules of Thumb by Dan Scott

Blue Sky

- Lighter in value than the land.
- Usually features color gradation, with richer and darker colors at the top. Less gradation if looking upwards.
- Use richer blues for making a statement. Reduce the saturation for a more subtle finish. Be aware that changes in saturation may also change the value.
- Cobalt blue is my go-to for a typical blue sky. I also use ultramarine blue if I need something stronger and manganese blue if I need something a bit closer to green. Sometimes, I use various blues in the same sky to add complexity and interest.

Open Seas

- The colors are usually determined by the surrounding environment rather than the water itself.
- Reflections are compressed—the lights are a touch darker, and the darks are a touch lighter than the object being reflected.
- For calm seas, the highlights may fan out evenly across the flat water. For choppy seas, the highlights will be more erratic and will concentrate on the contours and edges of the water.
- Use color gradation to suggest changes in the water's depth. Deeper water = deeper, richer colors.
- Don't default to blue. Be open-minded when deciding on what colors to use. Water can appear blue, but not always.
- For deep blue areas, my ultramarine blue is my go-to. I might also throw a bit of viridian green into the

Waves

- Water has both translucent and reflective qualities. Whitewash on the surface is also more opaque. This makes it complex and dynamic.
- Consider using different techniques and approaches for different areas (translucent, reflective, and opaque areas). The techniques you use to apply color can influence how they're perceived.
- Make sure you go light enough in translucent areas. Cobalt blue, cadmium yellow light, and titanium white is a good combination for this.
- Waves will typically have a dark area around the base where the water is deeper. Go richer and darker with your colors here. You can use this dark area to make the lighter colors really "pop".
- Don't default to pure titanium white for highlights. Consider light yellows, blues, greens, reds, etc. Reserve pure titanium white for the brightest highlights. Treat them as exclamation points in the painting.

Shallows

- We typically paint shallow water from a downward perspective. The water will appear more translucent and less reflective from this perspective.
- The colors will be heavily influenced by the sandy floor. The shallower the water = the stronger the influence of the sand colors.
- You can suggest the presence of water with a few ripples and a tint of blue-green.
- Look for soft highlights and dark accents along the shoreline.

Sand

- Typically, a light, orange-yellow color.
- Consider reducing the saturation. Don't go too strong with the sand color.
- Yellow ochre plus titanium white is a good starting point. Make it warmer or cooler depending on the environment.
- Wet sand will appear darker and may have a cool tint. A hint of purple seems to work well for wet sand along the shoreline.



Leaves and Grass

- Color temperature is key. Segment the areas into warm or cool. For warm areas, lean into the yellows and reds. For the cool areas, lean into the blues and greens.
- Use accents and highlights to add bursts of clarity and interest.
- Don't default to green. Consider all the other colors as well. Observe without judgment and paint the colors you see not what you think you see.
- Multicolored strokes and broken colors are effective techniques here.
- Don't get caught up in the tiny details. Think in terms of big, simple color shapes first. Then narrow in on the detail as needed.

White Objects

- The light will determine the colors you use. This is the case with all colored objects, but it's especially true with white objects. Warm light source = warm lights, cool shadows. Cool light source = cool lights, warm shadows.
- Be on high alert when painting white objects. They invite all kinds of color tricks and illusions. For example, white objects in shadow often appear lighter than they really are.
- Be careful about overusing pure titanium white. It's used less than you might think for white objects. Just because an object is white, doesn't necessarily mean you must paint it with white. The goal is to make it appear white in the context of your painting. It's worth analyzing master paintings featuring white objects and noticing all the different colors they use and the relationships between those colors.

Clouds

- Look for the separation between light and shadow. It may be weak, but there will usually be some separation. This is what will give your clouds some sense of structure and form.
- Don't go too strong with the highlights and dark accents. Work up to them.
- · Be interesting. Don't overuse pure gray and white. Consider light yellows, greens, purples, reds, etc.
- Consider repeating similar colors from other parts of the painting. For example, if the sea features strong use of ultramarine blue, perhaps you can continue that theme in the sky by using a light version of ultramarine blue in the clouds.
- Position the brightest highlights close to the dark or saturated accents to make a statement.

Mountains

- Good for conveying atmospheric perspective. Consider exaggerating the effects to push the depth (make the distant mountains a bit fainter and cooler).
- Simplify the colors into major light and dark shapes. Don't get lost in all the detail. If you over-render the mountains, you risk bringing them forward in perspective.
- Distant mountains will typically be darker than the sky above, but it may not look that way.
- For areas of snow, don't jump straight to titanium white. Start with a pale blue and go from there.
- The role the mountains play in the painting will influence the colors I use. If the mountains are the focal point, I might use stronger and richer colors.
