Prior to her position at Ursuline, Ms. McCall was an adjunct professor of art at The University of North Texas in Denton and an adjunct professor at Brookhaven College in Dallas where she taught painting, drawing and design. McCall is still involved in the north Texas community. McCall received her BFA at Southern Methodist University and MFA at The University of North Texas; and studied art in Italy with Pratt Art Institute of NY. Her work has been included in numerous private collections and exhibitions including the Critic's Choice exhibition at the Dallas Center for Contemporary Art. Her work has been represented by Craighead-Green Gallery in Dallas, TX for 22 years.

Linda is currently a teacher of oil at The Woman's Club of Fort Worth. She will bring an oil and demonstrate techniques in oil painting suitable for oil or acrylic.





Fun at the Junk Journal Workshop


Sarah Fino, WAA Workshop

Artists from the area were treated to a day-long Junk Journaling workshop in September, taught by WAA artist, Sarah Fino. Participants discovered that handmade Junk Journals or Treasure Books are the best kind of art addiction for some artists. Chock full of ordinary and exotic materials, combined with an unlimited dose of creativity, artists created their handmade books in a flurry of inspired exploration.

Journals are created from the everyday papers, cartons, tags and other materials that surround us and that most of us take for granted. Hand-dyed and decorated papers and found materials are combined into signatures or sections of each journal and bound with a cloth and board book cover constructed with each artist's personal color and material choices.

As each artist created their journal, Sarah encouraged them to focus on a theme. It could be a record of a special trip, or a memory book of a special occasion, or just art visualized from thirty days of one-word prompts, the possibilities are endless.

On this day, each artist went home with their journal created from scratch, ready to be filled with customized memories and art.




