Ten Fun facts about Chandor Gardens

Chandor Gardens, a unique blend of English and Chinese styles in Weatherford, was

created by famous portrait artist Douglas Chandor, features a man-made "mountain," was once home to a shotgun-toting Ina who guarded against armadillos, was abandoned for 16 years after the Chandors died, and was restored by the Bradfords before being acquired by the city, making it a historic gem filled with whimsical fountains and secret garden rooms.

Here are 10 fun facts about Chandor Gardens:

1. Created by a Famous Painter: British-born portrait artist Douglas Chandor, who painted Winston Churchill and FDR, designed the gardens starting in 1936.
2. Original Name Was "White Shadows." Douglas first called his creation White Shadows, a nod to the stark Texas landscape, but his wife, Ina, renamed them Chandor Gardens after his death.
3. A "Mountain" Was Built: Chandor's dream was to build a mountain, so he created Cox's Mountain, complete with a cascading waterfall, a feature inspired by Ohio Governor James Cox.
4. Ina's Shotgun Nights: To protect the garden from pests, Ina Chandor would use her shotgun at night, breaking the Texas silence to deter armadillos.
5. Abandoned for 16 Years: After Ina's death in 1978, the gardens closed and were neglected for 16 years, becoming overgrown before new owners arrived.
6. Unique Fountains Made From Junk: The Dragon Fountain features Coke and 7-Up bottles, marbles, and ceramic tiles, showcasing Chandor's creative reuse of materials.
7. Chinese & English Fusion: The design seamlessly blends traditional English garden elements like pergolas and bowling greens with Chinese features like Moon Gates and Chi-Lin statues.
8. National Historic Landmark: The home and gardens are officially listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
9. Restored by Enthusiasts: Melody and Chuck Bradford bought the property in 1994 and spent years restoring its ponds and landscapes before the City of Weatherford acquired it in 2002.
10. A Secret Garden: The property is known as a "hidden gem," offering intimate garden rooms and winding paths that feel like a secret retreat, even hosting special events and retreats today. Chandor Gardens | Parker County Master Gardener Association

Douglas Chandor's White Shadows. The Gardens were established in 1936. There are approximately 16½ acres, and about 3½ acres are developed.
